

TOP 5 BUSIEST LARGEST AIRPORTS IN THE US

Featuring the largest airport in the US and the biggest airport in the US by passenger traffic and size

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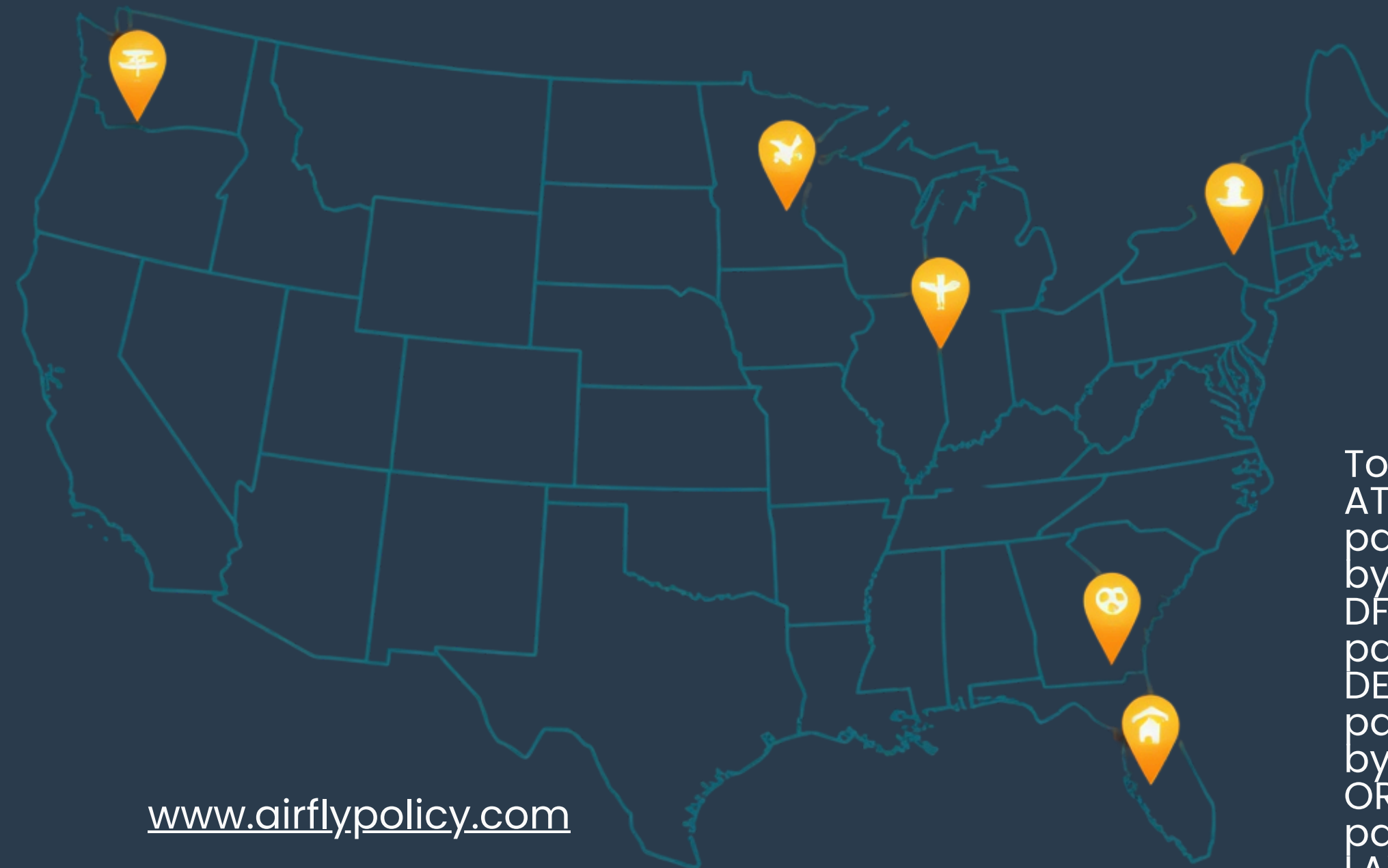
From the biggest airport in the US by passenger traffic to the largest airport in the US by land area, these airports represent the backbone of American aviation infrastructure.

The United States is home to some of the world's most trafficked airports. These five major hubs handle hundreds of millions of passengers annually, serving as critical gateways for domestic and international travel across the country.

THE BUSIEST AND LARGEST AIRPORTS IN THE US

Top 5 Airports:
ATL – 100M+ passengers (biggest by traffic)
DFW – 75M+ passengers
DEN – 70M+ passengers (largest by land: 53 sq mi)
ORD – 70M+ passengers
LAX – 65M+ passengers

Together, these five airports handle over 450 million passengers per year, making them the busiest and largest airports in the US. ATL leads as the world's busiest airport, while DEN holds the title of largest airport in the US by land area at 53 square miles.

Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) holds the title of the world's busiest airport. As the biggest airport in the US by passenger traffic, ATL serves as a major connecting hub for both domestic and international routes, handling over 100 million passengers each year.

HARTSFIELD-JACKSON ATLANTA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (ATL)

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One of the busiest and largest airports in the US, Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport (DFW) serves as a critical hub connecting millions of travelers across domestic and international routes every year, handling over 75 million passengers annually.

DALLAS/FORT WORTH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (DFW)

DFW is the primary hub for American Airlines, one of the world's largest carriers. The airport spans over 17,000 acres and features five terminals with 165+ gates, making it one of the largest airport facilities in the country.

With direct flights to over 250 destinations worldwide, DFW connects the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex to major cities across North America, Europe, Asia, and Latin America.

Largest airport in the US by land area, one of the biggest airports in the US — DEN covers 53 square miles and serves over 70 million passengers annually, making it a critical hub in the American aviation network.

DENVER INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (DEN)

Third busiest airport in the US with approximately 70+ million passengers annually. A major hub connecting domestic and international routes across North America.

LAX is the main airport for the Los Angeles metropolitan area, one of the most populous regions in the United States. As a major international hub, it handles an enormous volume of both domestic and international passengers, making it one of the busiest and biggest airports in the US.

65+ million passengers annually, ranking it among the top airports in the US by traffic volume.

Primary gateway for international travel to Asia and Oceania, with connections to over 90 countries worldwide.
