Skipping the Budget Conversation (With Everyone)

Here's mistake number one. People tiptoe around finances. Between themselves. With their families. And especially with planners.

Have the awkward chat now. Get specific with amounts: your current savings, what family is contributing, and your monthly saving power.

Forgetting to Budget for Hidden Costs

You've accounted for the venue. The shooters are secured. The dress is ordered. You think you've nailed it.

Then the "oh right" expenses hit. Delivery fees. Taxes not included. Hotel for the planner.

These are classic common mistakes to avoid in wedding planning. Industry research from Wedding.com.my found that hidden costs add roughly RM5,000 to the final bill.

The cure? Question each professional: "What is NOT included in this price?" Get it in writing. Finally, keep an emergency RM3,000 aside. Future you will be so grateful.

The Instinct You Should Never Suppress

This mistake breaks our hearts. Couples meet a wedding planner. Something feels off. But their portfolio is stunning. So you push through.

Huge error. A blunder that leads to sleepless nights is overriding your intuition.

That small eye roll? It becomes shouting match by month three. If a planner makes you feel small during the sales pitch, picture them during a vendor no-show.

Location and coordinators: one year ahead.

Shooters, musicians, food: ten months at least.

Flowers, dessert, tables: eight to ten months.

Dress, suit, bridal party outfits: 9-12 months.

Miss these windows and feel the stress. Set phone reminders. Then trust the process.

Weather Worries You Cannot Ignore

Rain is part of our life. Everyone understands this. Even so, repeatedly, weddings get caught in downpours.

A flash flood warning — they're almost guaranteed. A logistical error that ruins photos is trusting luck over logistics.

Get this answer early: “How do you handle a storm?” If they say “we'll figure it out”, that's a risk.

Budget for a tent or awning rental. Also, alert your videographer that wet weather makes for amazing reflections.

Forgetting to Enjoy the Process

This one goes at the bottom for a reason. You become obsessed with timelines. You cry about invitation fonts. And somewhere along the way, you miss the meaning entirely.

The number one error above all others is sacrificing your peace for perfection.

The party ends at midnight. But your partnership is forever. No one remembers the font on the menu. They recall the laughter during speeches.
