

A malfunctioning garage door can affect security, convenience, and entry to your home. Whether your garage door will not open, will not close, makes unexpected sounds, or appears crooked, the right repair depends on the malfunctioning component and the door's general condition. For Los Angeles homeowners, local climate and property conditions also matter. Mild weather allows many doors to operate year-round, but intense sun can deteriorate paint, plastic components, insulation, and the garage door weather seal.

Other causes include a disconnected garage door cable, a locked door, an obstruction, or a failed torsion spring. Opener troubleshooting can identify simple electrical issues, but a door that is crooked, unusually heavy, or hanging from one side needs qualified assistance. Do not repeatedly operate the opener if the spring or cable appears broken.

When Would a Garage Door Panel Repair Become Necessary?

A garage door panel may be fixed when it has a minor dent, minor surface damage, or a minor hardware problem. A technician can sometimes reshape a panel, replace a hinge, or reestablish the connection between sections. On a sectional garage door, however, a seriously bent section can interfere with rollers and stress the garage door track.

Inspect the garage door weather seal at the bottom and sides as well. Sun exposure in Los Angeles can make rubber brittle and cracked. 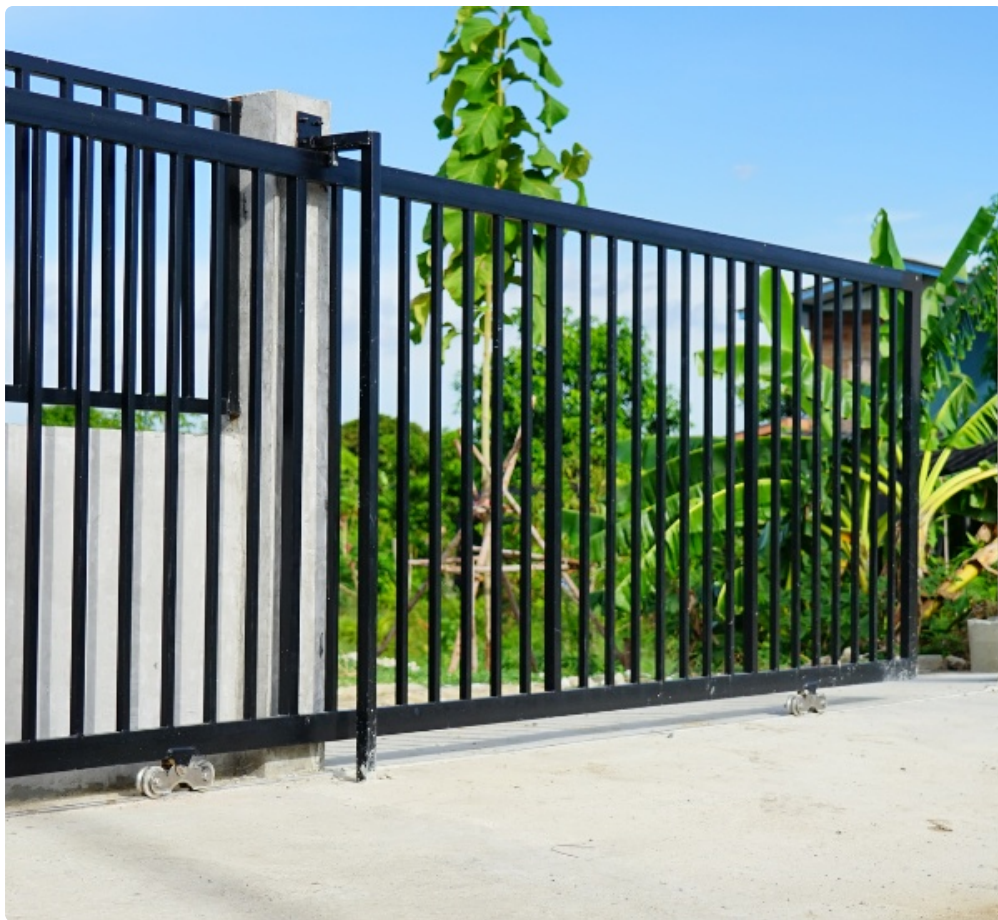
