Homes in St George take a pounding from red dust, difficult water, and long sunbaked summer seasons. Agitation matters. A CRB with soft brushes works like magic on matted traffic lanes. On small tasks, a grooming rake is much better than nothing, particularly to disperse pre-spray and lift pile before extraction.

Rinse and extract with care. High heat helps reduce viscosity of oils, however the real secret is balanced pressure and constant stroke speed. 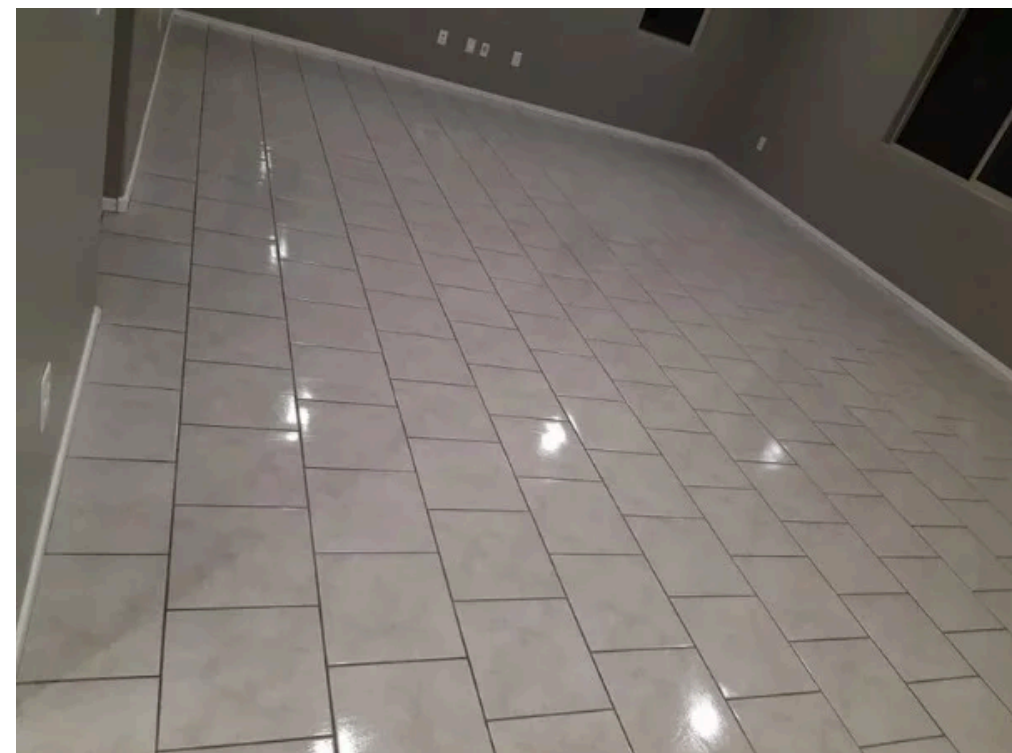
