A guitarist warmed up on "Gim me Sanctuary," a teen vocalist ran harmony lines, and a drummer counted off at half rate, then full throttle. No one was awaiting consent. That's the heart beat of a correct rock band program: enter, make a mess, carve the track right into something worth playing live.

The Anatomy of a Rock Band Program in Woodstock

Programs vary in shape, but the bones are similar. You audition or obtain placed based upon ability and experience. Bands fulfill as soon as a week, usually for 90 minutes to 2 hours. Over a cycle of 6 to twelve weeks, the group builds a set of four to eight songs. Somewhere therein, you enter a recording session, also a brief one, to record a minimum of a harsh trial.
