What lock rekeying actually changes

In those cases, the right answer is often a combination of repair and a fresh key plan, not one or the other in isolation. A seasoned locksmith will check alignment, cylinder condition, and door fit before deciding what should happen next.

Why offices and stores often rekey after staffing changes

An office, storefront, or service counter may have multiple employees, temporary access, and locks that need to [car lockout](#) stay organized across several entry points. A business owner who needs tighter control may call a [commercial locksmith](#) after turnover, schedule changes, or a lost key report, because access control becomes harder to track the more people are involved.
