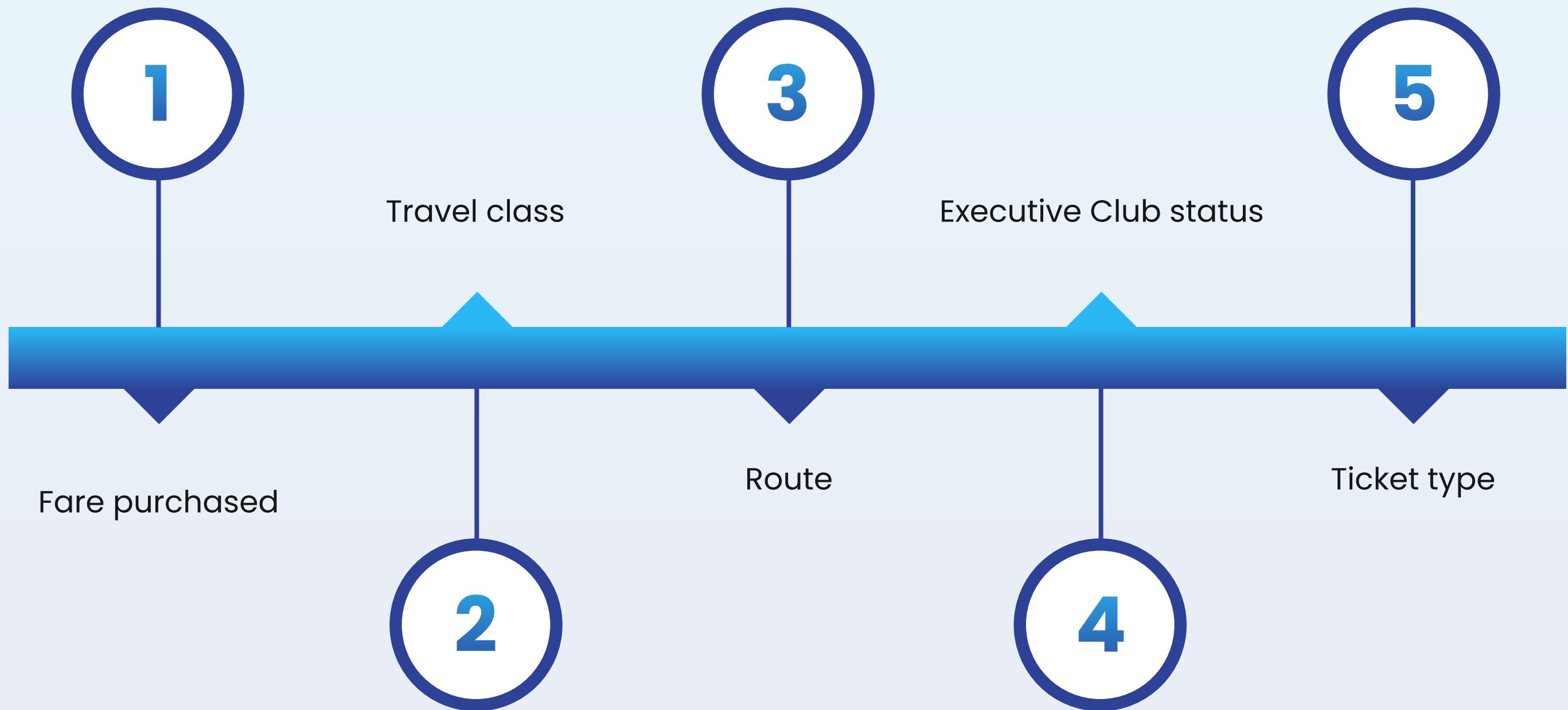

What is British Airways Baggage Allowance?

The British Airways Baggage Allowance refers to the maximum number, size, and weight of bags passengers can carry without paying additional charges.

The allowance depends on:



Checking your baggage allowance before departure helps prevent unexpected fees.

Cabin Baggage Allowance

British Airways allows passengers to bring cabin baggage onboard.

Typical allowance includes:

1

One Cabin Bag

- Maximum dimensions:
- 56 × 45 × 25 cm
- Weight up to 23 kg

2

One Personal Item

- Examples include:
- Laptop bag
- Handbag
- Small backpack
- Briefcase

3

Maximum dimensions:

- 40 × 30 × 15 cm

Both items must fit safely in the overhead compartment or under the seat.

Checked Baggage Allowance

The British Airways Baggage Allowance for checked baggage depends on cabin class.

Economy Basic

- Usually no checked baggage included

Economy Standard

- One checked bag

Premium Economy

- Two checked bags

Business Class

- Two checked bags

First Class

- Up to three checked bags

Always verify your ticket for your exact baggage entitlement.



Checked Bag Size and Weight

Each checked bag generally should not exceed:

1

Maximum Weight

- 23 kg (50 lbs)

Maximum Dimensions

- Up to 90 × 75 × 43 cm

3

Passengers with heavier luggage may need to:

- Purchase additional baggage
- Repack items
- Pay overweight charges

Proper planning helps avoid airport surprises.

Carry-On Packing Tips

To maximize your **British Airways Baggage Allowance**, pack smart.

Suggestions include:

*Roll clothing instead
of folding*

Use packing cubes

*Carry electronics in
your personal item*

*Wear heavier
clothing*

*Use lightweight
luggage*

*Keep liquids
organized*

Efficient packing creates extra space while staying within limits.

Excess Baggage Fees

Passengers exceeding their baggage allowance may pay additional fees for:

- Overweight baggage
- Oversized baggage

Fees vary depending on:

- Destination
- Route
- Weight
- Number of bags

Purchasing extra baggage online before departure is often less expensive than paying at the airport.

Small instruments may travel as cabin baggage if they meet size limits.
