How to Use DeltaWiFi on Your Next Delta Flight

DeltaWiFi makes it easier for passengers to stay connected while traveling. Whether you want to check emails, message family, browse the web, or handle work during your flight, Delta offers in-flight connectivity on many aircraft. Knowing how to connect before takeoff can make your journey more productive and convenient.

What Is Delta Wi-Fi?

DeltaWiFi is Delta Air Lines' in-flight internet service. On equipped aircraft, passengers can connect smartphones, tablets, and laptops to the onboard Wi-Fi network. Availability and performance can vary depending on the aircraft, route, altitude, and other operational factors.

Delta has expanded Wi-Fi availability across its fleet, making connectivity an important part of the modern Delta travel experience.



Check Wi-Fi Availability Before Your Flight

Before traveling, check whether your particular Delta flight offers Wi-Fi. Most Delta flights provide connectivity, but service can vary by aircraft and route.

You can also check the aircraft information associated with your reservation. Because aircraft assignments can sometimes change, Wi-Fi availability should be considered subject to change.

Tip: Keep important travel information, boarding passes, and entertainment available offline in case connectivity is temporarily unavailable.

Prepare Your Device

Before boarding, make sure your smartphone, tablet, or laptop is charged. Since you may use your device throughout the flight, carrying a portable charger can also be useful when permitted.

Before departure:

*Update your device
if necessary.*

Turn on Wi-Fi.

Close unnecessary apps.

*Download important
documents.*

*Save entertainment for
offline use.*

*Keep your browser
updated.*

Preparing your device in advance can make connecting to **Delta Wi-Fi** much easier.

Turn On Airplane Mode

Once the aircraft reaches the appropriate stage of the flight, follow the crew's instructions regarding electronic devices. Turn on Airplane Mode on your phone, tablet, or laptop. After enabling Airplane Mode, you can generally turn Wi-Fi back on if permitted. This allows your device to connect to the aircraft's Wi-Fi network while keeping cellular communications disabled.



Internet Packages

After Wi-Fi is available, open your device's Wi-Fi settings and look for the onboard Delta Wi-Fi network.

Select the appropriate network and wait for your device to connect. If the connection does not automatically open a login or welcome page, open your web browser and visit the onboard Wi-Fi portal.

The portal provides instructions for accessing available connectivity services.

Follow the On-Screen Instructions

Once connected to DeltaWiFi, follow the instructions displayed on the Wi-Fi portal. Depending on the service available on your flight, you may see options for complimentary connectivity, entertainment, or other onboard services. Read the displayed terms and select the service you want to use. If the portal does not load immediately, make sure you are connected to the correct onboard Wi-Fi network and try opening a new browser tab.

Use Free Wi-Fi When Available

Delta has introduced complimentary Wi-Fi on many flights for eligible passengers. Availability can depend on the aircraft and route.

When complimentary Wi-Fi is available, passengers may be asked to sign in or identify themselves through the onboard portal.

A SkyMiles account can be useful when accessing Delta services, so travelers should make sure their account information is readily available before boarding.

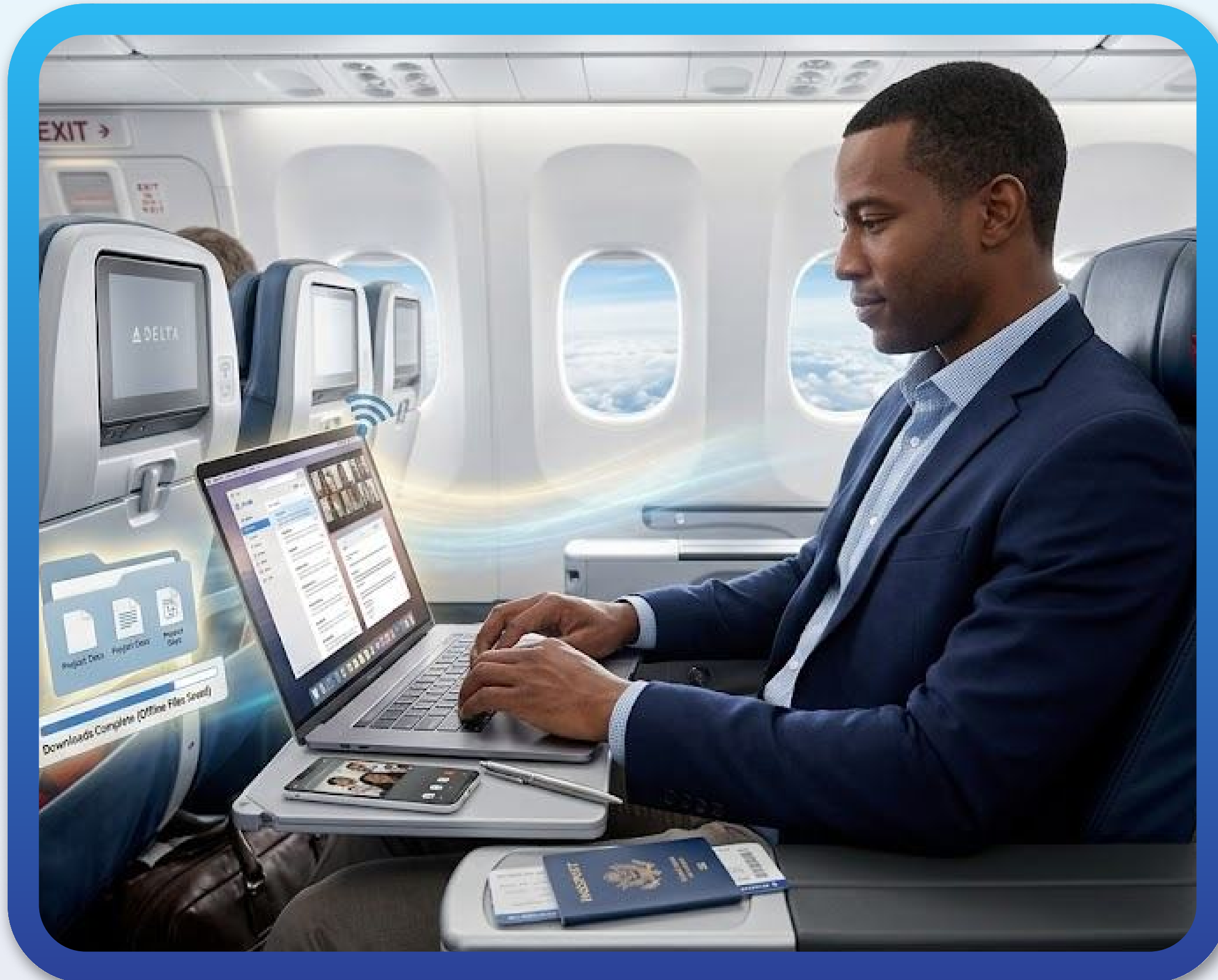

Delta Wi-Fi for Business Travelers



For business travelers, DeltaWiFi can make long flights more productive. Passengers can use connectivity to review emails, communicate with colleagues, work on cloud-based documents, or prepare for meetings.

However, travelers should avoid relying exclusively on in-flight internet for critical work. Download essential files before departure and save important information offline in case the connection becomes unavailable.
