Camera bag

Carry-on baggage must fit safely in overhead storage compartments.

Carry-On Size Restrictions

Carry-on bags must meet airline size requirements.

Important Considerations:



Length, width, and height restrictions apply



Wheels and handles count toward dimensions



Oversized carry-on bags may be checked at the gate

Travelers should measure their luggage before arriving at the airport to ensure compliance with Hawaiian Airlines Baggage Allowance rules.

Personal Item Guidelines

Personal items should fit underneath the seat in front of you.

Accepted Personal Items:

Passengers should keep essential travel documents, medications, and valuables inside their personal items.

Checked Baggage Overview

Checked baggage fees may vary depending on route and ticket type.



Standard Checked Bag Weight Limits

Most checked bags must comply with standard weight restrictions.

Typical Requirements:

Maximum weight: 50 pounds (23 kg)

Standard size limitations apply

Avoid overweight fees

Faster baggage processing

Reduced travel costs

Weigh luggage before departure to prevent additional charges.

Checked Bag Fees

Checked baggage fees can vary depending on:

- Destination
- Fare type
- Travel class
- Loyalty program status
