What Is the Labor-Rate Tier for Systems Approaching 30 Years?

HVAC labor rates vary by job complexity, and older systems typically demand higher labor charges because they require more diagnostic time, careful handling, and often part sourcing. A straightforward fan motor replacement on a 5-year-old system might cost \$400 in labor. The same job on a 25-year-old unit—where the technician must verify compatibility, check adjacent components, and make sure no collateral damage—may run \$600 to \$750. 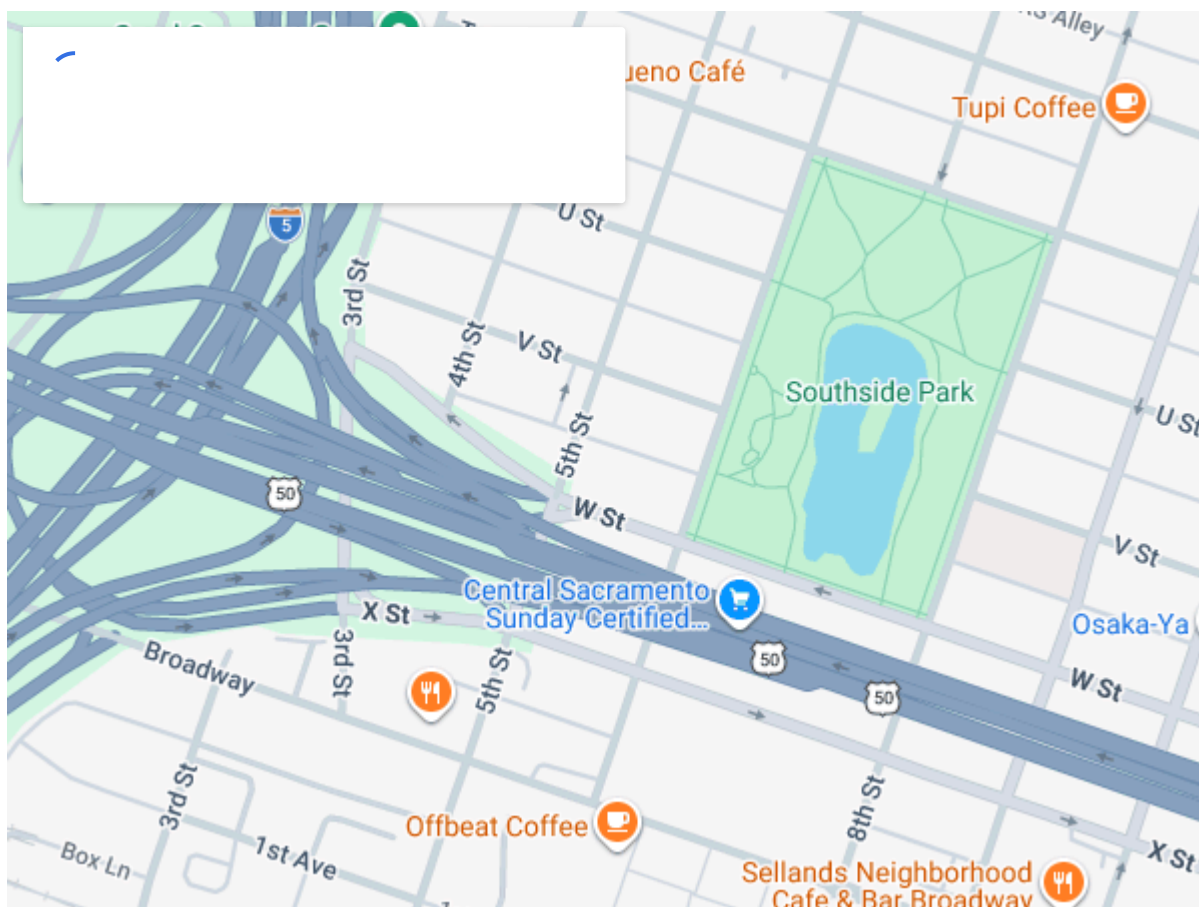
