

A roof rarely gets much attention until something goes wrong. That is understandable. I have seen roofs that looked fine from the driveway but had enough wet leaf buildup behind a chimney to hold moisture against flashing for months. I have also seen fairly new roofs stained badly on the north side because overhanging limbs kept the surface damp long after the rest of the house had dried. Those are not rare cases. They are typical examples of how local conditions matter more than age alone.

Why roof cleaning is more than curb appeal

A cleaner roof does make a home look better, and that matters. If you are planning to sell, the roof is one of the first things buyers notice. Dark stains and moss patches suggest neglect, even when the shingles still have life left. But appearance is only part of the story.

Organic growth holds moisture. Moisture accelerates wear. When shingles stay wet longer than they should, the granule surface can deteriorate faster. Moss can lift shingle edges and create little pockets where water and debris gather. Gutters can also suffer when roof runoff carries down loosened muck and leaf residue, especially after a storm.
