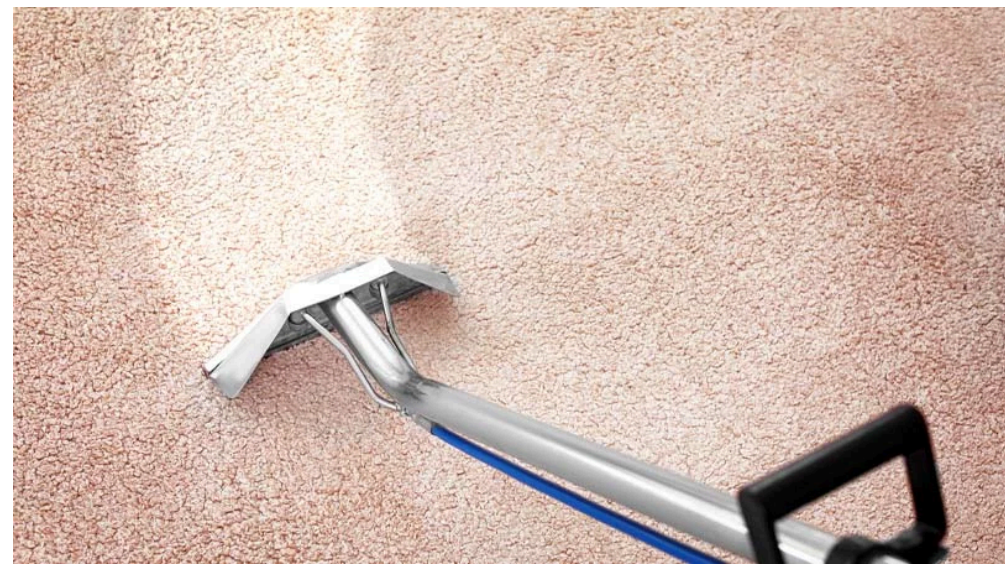
The important pre-clean inspection
