

A breakdown in Phoenix rarely happens at a convenient time. It happens in grocery store parking lots when the asphalt is radiating heat, on the shoulder of Loop 202 during rush hour, outside an apartment complex in Gilbert after dark, or in a quiet neighborhood where a simple mistake like locking the keys inside the car suddenly feels much bigger than it should. What good roadside assistance actually looks like

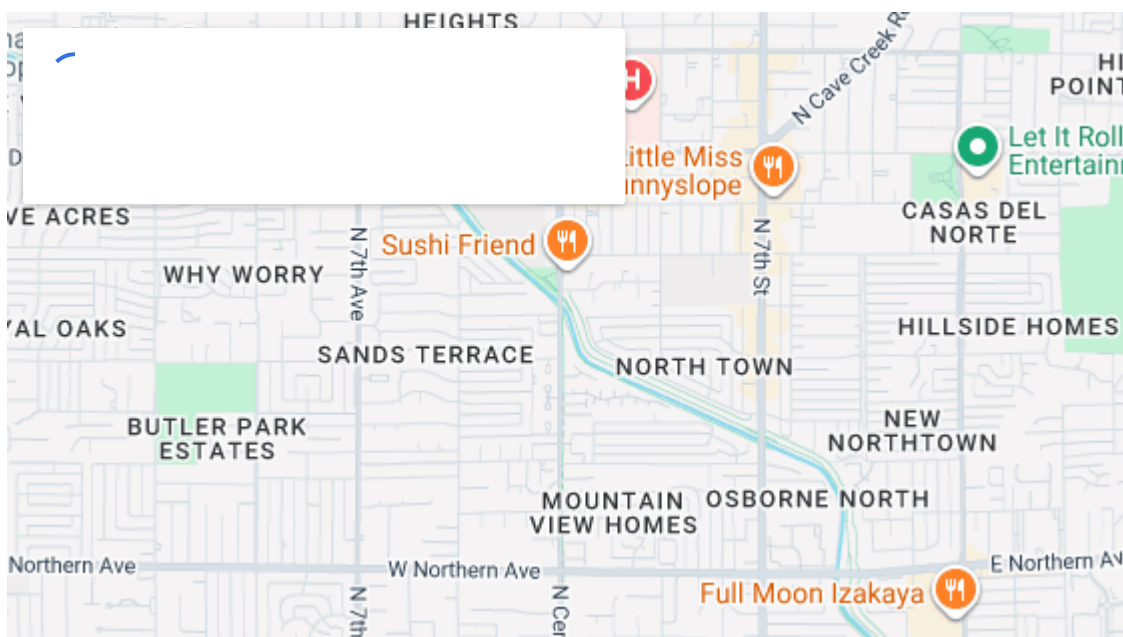
