Most passengers are allowed to bring:

- One carry-on bag
- One personal item

Personal items may include:

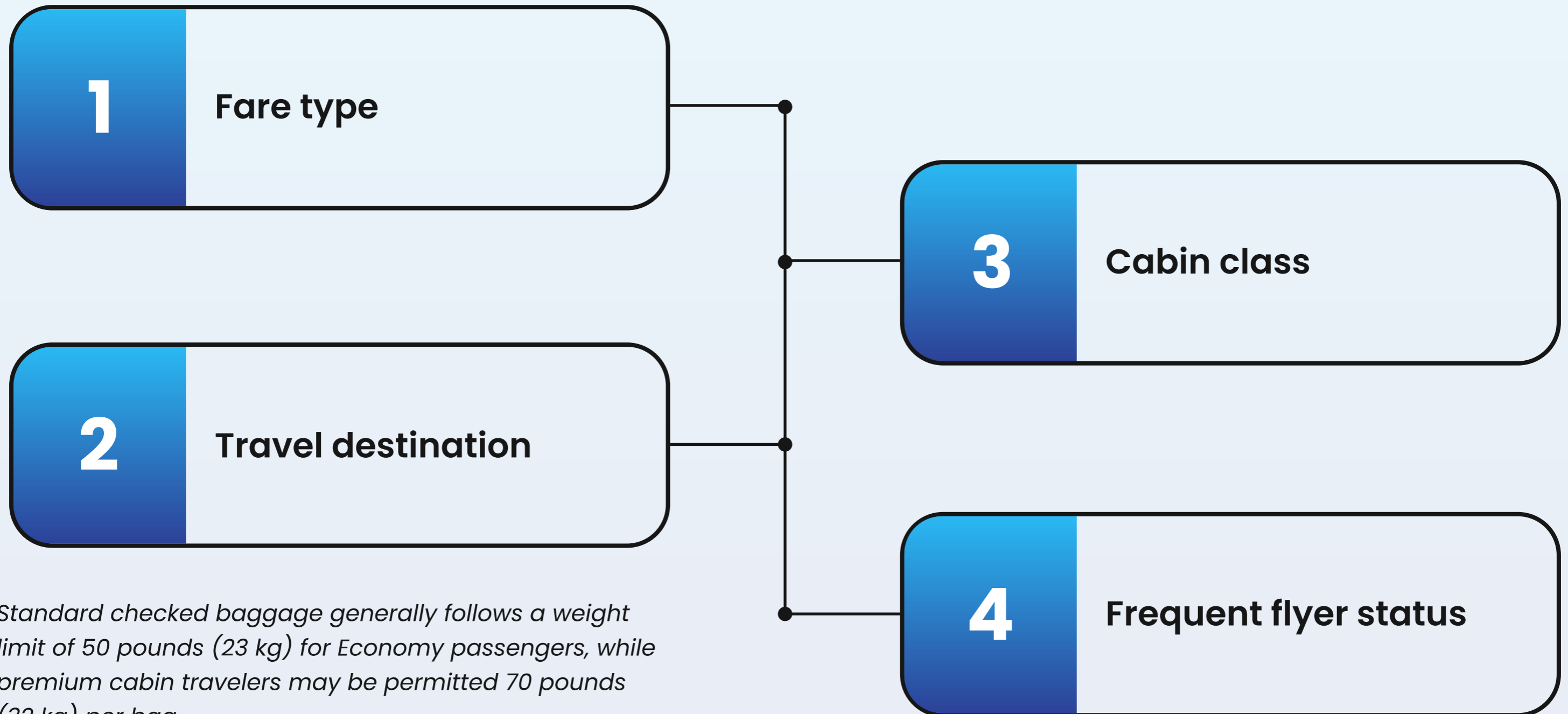
- Handbag
- Laptop bag
- Small backpack
- Briefcase

Carry-on bags should fit in the overhead bin, while personal items must fit underneath the seat in front of you.

Always confirm size restrictions before departure.

Checked Baggage Rules

The American Airlines baggage policy includes checked baggage allowances that depend on:



Standard checked baggage generally follows a weight limit of 50 pounds (23 kg) for Economy passengers, while premium cabin travelers may be permitted 70 pounds (32 kg) per bag.

Always review your itinerary for the exact allowance.

Baggage Weight Limits

Weight restrictions are an important part of the **American Airlines baggage policy**.

Common weight categories include:

1

Up to 50 lbs (23 kg)

Standard allowance

2

Up to 70 lbs (32 kg)

Premium cabin and eligible elite members

3

Over 70 lbs

May incur additional fees or restrictions

Weighing your luggage before heading to the airport can help you avoid unexpected charges.

Oversized Baggage

In addition to weight limits, luggage must also meet size requirements.

Oversized baggage may include:

When a bag exceeds both weight and size limits, separate charges may apply.

Proper planning helps reduce unnecessary baggage expenses.

Baggage Fees

The cost of checked baggage depends on several factors, including:

- Number of checked bags
- Domestic or international route
- Fare purchase
- Travel class

Passengers can often save money by paying baggage fees online before arriving at the airport.

Checking baggage policies in advance allows travelers to budget accurately.

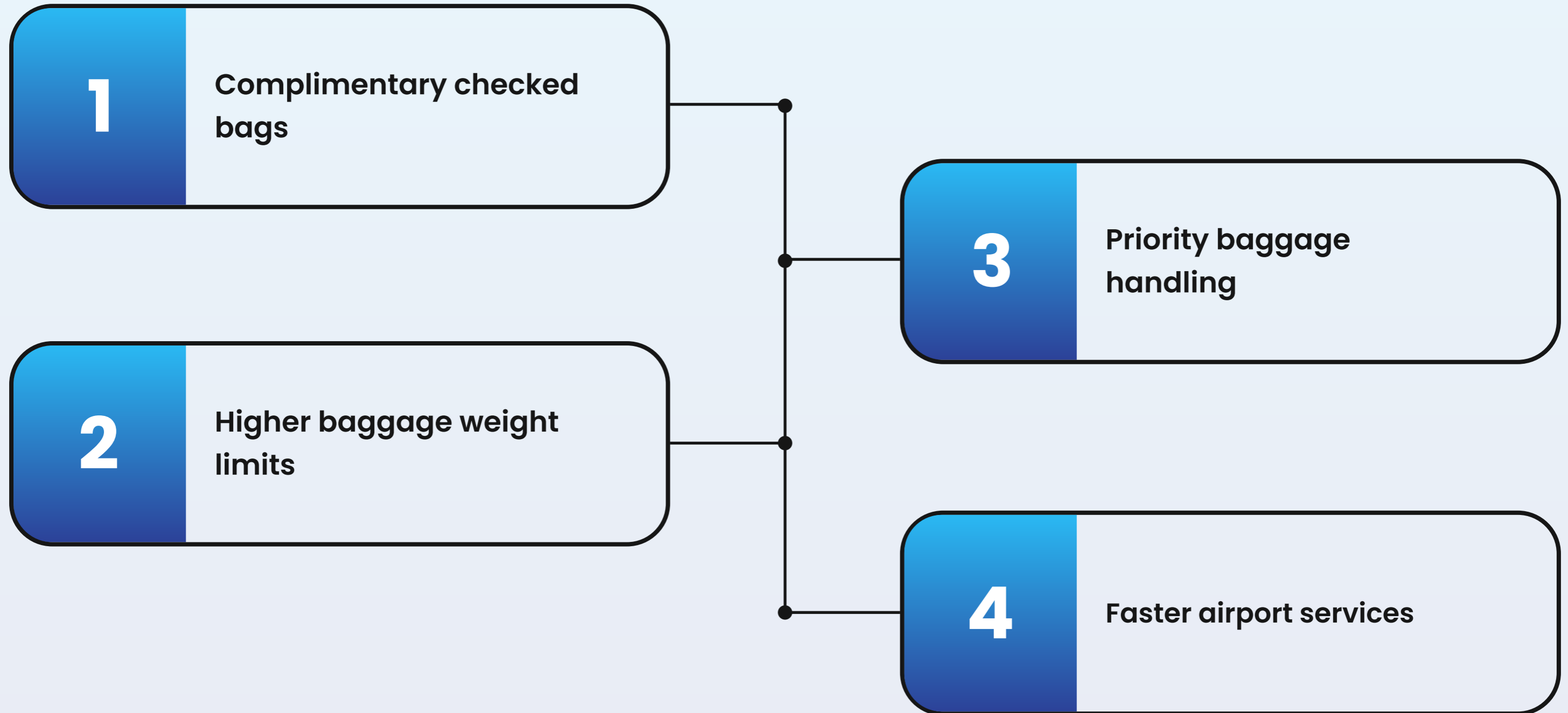
