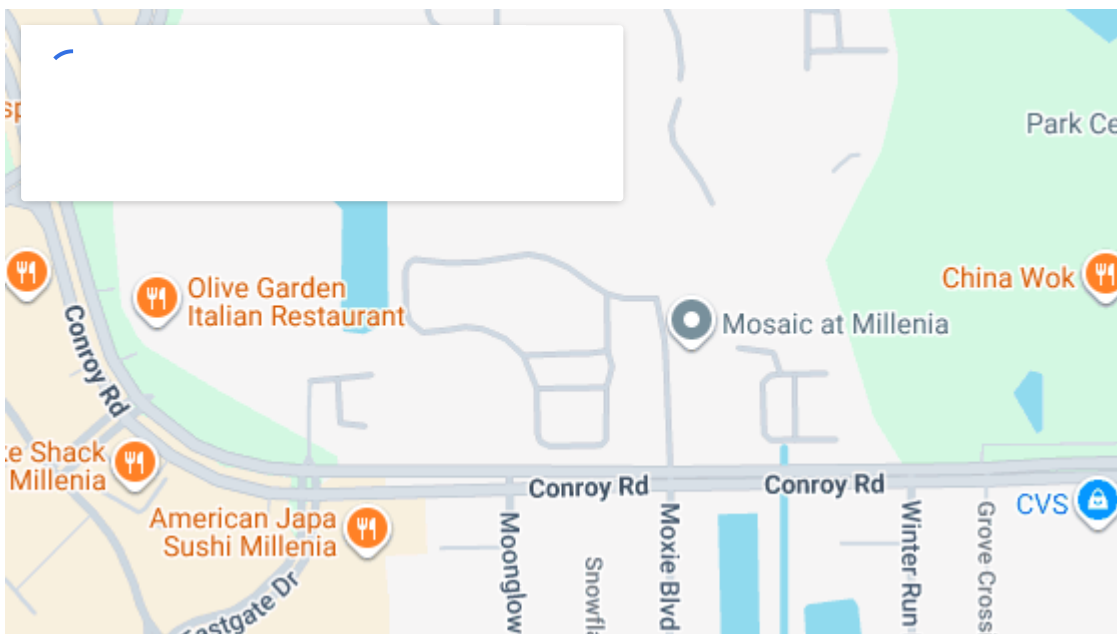
Why auto service overlaps with other locksmith work
